## **Prof Simon Kay**

Prof Simon Kay Is a Plastic Surgeon with a career-long record of high-quality care and innovation in children's surgery, microsurgery and nerve surgery. He now heads the UK Hand Transplant team in Leeds and has led the development and implementation of that practice over the last 10 years. He has Chaired (President) the Boards of the two main surgical associations in his field (Hand Surgery and Plastic Surgery) and has served as Editor and Chair of a major clinical Journal (JPRAS). In these roles, he has led important changes of culture and rebranding. He has edited two world-leading multi-author textbooks. Prof Simon Kay's work has been recognised with the appointment to OBE in 2019. As he gradually withdraws from clinical surgery, he is open to new areas of responsibility and challenges to engage his abilities and develop further.

Prof Simon Kay's enduring interests have centered around behaviour, the origins of medical knowledge, and the ethics and morals of care including transplantation.



### **Dominic Power**

Dominic Power is a Consultant Peripheral Nerve Surgeon and Honorary Senior Lecturer at Birmingham University in the UK. He works as a hand and nerve surgeon within the National Health Service at the Birmingham Hand Centre and the West Midlands Brachial Plexus and Peripheral Nerve Injury Service which he founded in 2007. He has led the development of the peripheral nerve specialty in the United Kingdom with services for brachial plexus injury reconstruction, surgical management of neuropathic pain, upper limb reconstruction after spinal cord injury, hyper-selective neurectomy for spasticity management, reconstruction of paralysis after oncological resection and targeted muscle reinnervation for amputees. In 2012, Dominic established the first designated Peripheral Nerve Fellowship programme in Europe and has provided highly specialised training for peripheral nerve surgeons from across the globe.

He is currently Chief Investigator for two NIHR funded multi-centre trials in peripheral nerve surgery and has successfully delivered a portfolio of 8 academic, investigator-led, and commercial clinical trials in peripheral nerve surgery as Chief or Principal Investigator through the HaPPeN network.



### **Petros Mikalef**

Petros Mikalef is a Consultant Orthopaedic Hand and Spasticity surgeon who works at the Royal Orthopaedic Hospital in Birmingham. He has completed Fellowship training in Hand Surgery and in Spasticity Surgery. His classification system for surgical neurectomy has been adopted internationally.

His practice involves interventional treatment of focal Spasticity of the Upper and Lower Limb in Adults. He has organised Upper and Lower Limb Spasticity MDT Clinics at the Royal Orthopaedic Hospital. He has extended experience in the surgical treatment of Upper Limb Spasticity As well as selective neurectomies of the lower limb for Spasticity. His practice also involves elective Hand Surgery at the Royal Orthopaedic Hospital, a regional Centre for elective Hand Surgery. He works closely with the Centre of Peripheral Nerve Surgery at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital. Petros is a recognised tutor for the BSSH Hand Diploma and is actively involved in training. His research interests involve standardising preoperative assessment, and patient-reported outcome measures for spasticity.



### Radek Kebrle

Radek Kebrle is a leading European specialist in wrist surgery. He is regular faculty involved in training and lectures on wrist surgery across Europe.

He worked in the orthopedic department at the Hospital Novy Jičín followed by Institute of Hand Surgery and Plastic Surgery in Vysoké nad Jizerou and Trauma department in Liberec. Since 2002, he has been working as a visiting consultant for hand and hand therapy in pediatric rheumatology clinic, Charles University Hospital Prague. He also leads Hand department at the Clinic of Dr. Pirka in Mladá Boleslav, Czech Republic.

In 2009, he received the European Hand Diploma. He has completed a number of courses and workshops worldwide.
